Ottawa Aboriginal Coalition Hosts 2024 Career Fair – October 28, 2024

On October 28, 2024, the Ottawa Aboriginal Coalition (OAC) will host the 2024 Career Fair, a dynamic in-person event that brings together 10 Indigenous service organizations alongside 60 additional employers from a wide range of industries. These industries include Indigenous businesses, nonprofits, construction, education, government, healthcare, hospitality, tourism, real estate, and more. Open to both Indigenous and non-Indigenous job seekers, the fair provides a welcoming space to explore new career paths, connect with industry professionals, and discover exciting job opportunities.

In addition to job opportunities, the Career Fair will feature:

- An Indigenous Marketplace, showcasing the creativity and entrepreneurship of Indigenous artisans and vendors.
- Eight free workshops designed to enhance job search and career development skills including *Your Future in the Skilled Trades* by the Unionized Building and Construction Trades Council; *Financial Literacy* by the Canada Revenue Agency, *Career opportunities* with SMART Local 47; Explore the link between *Employment and Indigenous Health* with WCG Services; *Ottawa Police Services Recruitment Information Session*; the *Job Search Journey Workshop*, led by Kagita Mikam and the City of Ottawa; the OAC Well-Being Workshop and a special workshop designed by Inuuqatigiit Centre for *Inuit Students Navigating Post-Secondary Applications*.
- A Meet-and-Greet with OAC Elders and Knowledge Keepers Circle.

The Career Fair will also feature special displays on key OAC initiatives that will bring new jobs into Ottawa:

- The Minwaashin Lodge Family Healing Lodge,
- A new Inuit VAW Shelter, and
- Building an Urban Indigenous Housing Village.

The event will begin and conclude with ceremonies led by OAC Indigenous Ambassadors: First Nations Grandmother Irene Compton, Métis Knowledge Seeker, Patricia Griffin, and Inuit Elder Zippie Nochasak.
